What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information **for pupil education and welfare:**

- Names and contact details for students/children
- Names and contact details for carers
- Gender
- Date of birth
- Dietary requirements (including vegetarian, vegan, gluten free and halal requirements)

- Payment details and financial information including transactions
- Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) or additional support information (includes reasonable adjustments and special educational needs and disabilities)
- Welfare information (includes family and home life circumstances and history)
- Photographs
- Attendance and reason for absence data
- Progress reports
- Information relating to compliments and complaints
- Behavioural information

We also collect or use the following information **for pupil education and welfare:**

- Racial or ethnic origin
- Religious or philosophical beliefs
- Health information

We collect or use the following information **for information updates or marketing purposes:**

- Names and contact details
- Photographs
- Records of consent, where appropriate
- Alumni records

We collect or use the following information **to comply with legal requirements:**

- Identification documents

We also collect or use the following information **to comply with legal requirements:**

- Health information

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a “lawful basis” for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO’s website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are in brief set out below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO’s website:

- **Your right of access** - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. [You can read more about this right here.](#)
- **Your right to rectification** - You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. [You can read more about this right here.](#)
- **Your right to erasure** - You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information. [You can read more about this right here.](#)
- **Your right to restriction of processing** - You have the right to ask us to limit how we can use your personal information. [You can read more about this right here.](#)
- **Your right to object to processing** - You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data. [You can read more about this right here.](#)
- **Your right to data portability** - You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you. [You can read more about this right here.](#)

- **Your right to withdraw consent** – When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. [You can read more about this right here.](#)

If you make a request, we must respond to you without undue delay and in any event within one month.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information **for pupil education and welfare** are:

- Consent - we have permission from you after we gave you all the relevant information. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to object. To be clear, you do have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.
- Contract - we have to collect or use the information so we can enter into or carry out a contract with you. All of your data protection rights may apply except the right to object.
- Legal obligation - we have to collect or use your information so we can comply with the law. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to erasure, the right to object and the right to data portability.
- Vital interests - collecting or using the information is needed when someone's physical or mental health or wellbeing is at urgent or serious risk. This includes an urgent need for life sustaining food, water, clothing or shelter. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to object and the right to portability.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information **for information updates or marketing purposes** are:

How long we keep information

Data will be kept only for the period set out in our data retention Policy. This policy (available from the Office) sets out the minimum/maximum periods of retention of the personal data that we process. This is determined by:

- statutory duties and government guidance relating to schools, including for safeguarding;
- disclosure requirements for potential future litigation;
- contractual obligations;
- the law of confidentiality and privacy; and
- the General Data Protection Regulations and associated legislation.

Who we share information with

- Specialist teachers such as peripatetic workers or speech and language therapists
- Health care providers
- Organisations we need to share information with for safeguarding reasons
